Habitat



Emperor Penguins are large birds who live in Antarctica. They are warm blooded and they can survive in extremely cold temperatures. The baby starts its life on its father's feet.



<u>Appearance</u>

Emperor penguins are the largest of all the penguins. They can grow up to the height of a 7 year old child. What a tall bird! Adult penguins are mainly black and white with some yellow on their necks. The babies are grey and fluffy but when they grow up their fur turns into feathers.



Diet

Penguins eat fish, krill and squid. Mother penguins hunt for food for their babies. Did you know, they eat their food and spit it back up into their babies mouths? How strange!




Draw a spider with 2 legs because we are diving by 2





Now share 10 onto the each leg equally. Do one on one leg then one on the other until you have shared 10






Now count how many dots on each leg







For this question we need to draw a spider with 5 legs because we ar dividing by 5.



Now we can share out 20 onto each leg. Go round the spider and share them out equally.



Now we can count how many dots on each leg.



Each leg has 4 dots so our answer is 4.

Draw the penguin from the video but remember, your report will be on chinstrap penguins so don't forget his chinstrap!




Tuesday

Today we are going to learn a different method of dividing.

Instead of spiders we are going to use hoops.




For the question $15 \div 5 =$ we need to draw 5 hoops because we are dividing by 5.




Now we must share 15 dots into the 5 hoops.

Put 1 in each until you have shared out 15



Now count how many in each hoop.



Each hoop has 3 dots so our answer is 3. $15 \div 5 = 3$



For this question $20 \div 5$ = we need to draw a bar model with 5 parts at the bottom because we are dividing by 5.




bar model with 5 parts at the bottom



Count how many dots in each part




There are 4 dots in each part so our answer is 4.


These animals are carnivores that live in the sea. They all eat other **animals**.






Can you create some under water food chains? Remember to include a penguin.






