
Last week you did lots of art and creative activities! How are you getting on learning 'the dot song' and 'the self belief dance routine'?




This story is based on real events and this is a photograph of the real Stubby. He is a real hero and the men were lucky to have him





What you did is look for the tens and ones in the numbers.

We sometimes write tens and ones with a T and an O

T for tens O for ones

We can write T and O at the top of a number to help us see how many tens and ones are in a number.



When we order two digit numbers (that's a number with 2 numbers in) we must look at the amount of tens first.


The more tens a number has the bigger it is.

So 57 is bigger than 29 because 57 has 5 tens and 29 only had 2 tens.







When the tens are the same we then look at the ones.



So 31 is the smallest number.



These two helpful animals *Leo* and *Star* and going to help keep you active and get your heart racing.








When we draw the tens and ones it makes it easier for us to add them all up.



When we put the tens and ones into this diagram we can see the total of the two numbers made 56.





### Day 3: History



#### Dogs

Sentry dogs stayed with one soldier or guard and were taught to give a warning sound such as growling or barking when they sensed a stranger in the area or close to camp.



#### Pigeons

Animals were also often the most reliable way to transport messages. 100,000 carrier pigeons were used as

messengers during the war. Pigeons always flew home when released, so the troops made sure the pigeons' nests were in places they needed to send messages.



#### Horses

Horse were used for lots of reasons in the war. Soldiers would ride them into battle. Also, they were used to transport goods.

Ambulance horses carried wounded soldiers and other horses carried weapons, ammunition and other heavy loads.



#### Baboons

Jackie the baboon was taken to France by South African

soldiers. Jackie had excellent eyesight and hearing and used to warn soldiers of enemy movement or possible attacks by making noises and tugging on their clothing.




Yesterday we added numbers by counting the ones then the tens.

See if you can remember how to do it by answering this question...

What do we do if when we add the ones they make more than 9?



When we add the ones up there are 11.



When this happens we swap those 11 ones for a ten and a one.

Cross out the 11 ones and replace it with 1 ten and 1 one.

When we add the ones up there are 11.

Then add up the new set of tens and ones. Remember we do not count the ones that we crossed out.

There is now, 1 one and 3 tens which makes 31


Have a go at this addition question by exchanging the ones for a ten and ones.




We can start this by drawing our tens and ones again but only for the big number.


12 is made up of a ten and 2 ones so we take away a ten and 2 ones from our big number (26)






