PHONICS

Phonics, or the sounds that make up words, are a key skill for your child to possess when they are learning to read and write. In English, there are 44 phonemes but only 26 letters. This makes it a tricky skill to master. Any help that you can give your child at home will help them to become better at reading. Your child's teacher will be able to give you some advice, should you require it.



Mr Pedwell has reminded me that the Phonic Bug website is specifically designed for your child to practise their phonic skills. If you are interested in helping your child at home, see your child's class teacher for the password.

The Year One Phonics Check this year will be the week beginning 10th June.

The children are required to read forty individual words. Half of these words are "nonsense" words to determine whether children can apply their phonic knowledge and successfully decode previously unseen words.

They need to have a good knowledge of the 44 phonemes to do this successfully. Look in the middle of the Reading Diary for some of these phonemes, if you would like to help your child to learn them.



Latest research says that...

...using electronic tablets/phones and consuming energy drinks close to bedtime is contributing to sleep problems for school children.

...90% children do not get enough quality sleep; the recommended amount of sleep for young children is ten hours.



Have you thought of ...using foam letters in the bath? It helps your child remember spellings and develop their phonic skills.

You spell the word, take the letters off and your child tries to remember what you did. Have Fun!!!
